- 4. Funded by returns on endowment capital and capital investments.
- 5. The vision is implemented by three themes and hundreds of projects.


On average, materials in Europe are used only once.



Cars are standing still 92-98% of the time.






One third of food ends up in the trash bin. Around 80% of the nitrogen and between 25 and 75% of the phosphorus in food is wasted.


